About the Book





WRITE ABOUT IT!


In *Author vs. Illustrator*—and in every book!—a story needs to be written. On a separate sheet of paper, write about one (or more!) of the ideas below.

- Are you Team Author, or Team Illustrator? Or neither? Why?


WRITE A SUPERHERO STORY!

In *Author vs. Illustrator*, the creators appear in the book as illustrated versions—or caricatures—of themselves. In this activity, write about yourself on the left: your family, your hobbies, whatever! Then, on the right, draw a "cartoon" version of yourself. 
DRAW A MONSTER-PET!






